Faithfulness over time is the name of love

In this weekend's Gospel the Pharisees approach Jesus and ask him: "Is it against the law for a man to divorce his wife?". It is a very difficult question, and we know that Jesus' answer is very tough: "What God has united, man must not divide". The explanation to the disciples is even harder: "The man who divorces his wife and marries another is guilty of adultery against her. And if a woman divorces her husband and marries another she is guilty of adultery too".

This Gospel, we know, is probably one of the most difficult ones. In our society in particular it is quite incomprehensible. Nowadays few couples decide to get married. And among married people the rate of divorce is very high. Most young people decide not to marry at all, and if a problem does arise they just separate.

Nevertheless, Jesus is very clear: what God has united, man cannot divide. Even inside the Church, many people think that these words of Jesus are not relevant any more. The Church should be more modern, and accept divorce, they say. But it is clear to all of us that we do not have the authority to change the Gospel. The words of Jesus are our guidance, our light in every situation and time. We just have to try to understand and live by them.

That is why, if we reflect more deeply, we realise that fidelity is not a burden, but is something to aspire to. When a true friendship starts we would like it to never end. When true love for a man or a woman begins, the thought it could finish is just unbearable. True love and fidelity are two sides of the same experience.

I had the chance to listen to Benedict XVI in 2010 in Fatima, and I was struck when during a discourse he pronounced the astonishing affirmation: "Faithfulness over time is the name of love". Since then, I have always repeated this sentence to young couples, and to me it is now clearer that without faithfulness there is no true love.

Obviously we all know that fidelity can be hard. Jesus was aware of that too. And to the disciple that said to him: "If this is the situation between a husband and a wife, it is better not to marry", Jesus replied: "Nothing is impossible to God". Jesus knows that fidelity is the most beautiful experience and at the same time the most difficult. That is why we need help! Married people cannot think that they alone will be able to be faithful. They need to pray, they need to be supported by the community, by other families, and they need to help each other.

Which are the enemies of fidelity?

The first is habit. We get used to the presence of the other person. As time passes we think that we know everything of him or her. We just stop looking at the person that is with us. Nothing new is expected any more.

The second is the incapacity to forgive. For lots of reasons, such as pride, jealousy, lack of humility, we are not able to accept the other. We see the other as an enemy and not as the one we loved.

This year we have 15 couples that will get married in our parish. We would like to think of them this weekend. Their hope for the future reminds us that a true and faithful love is what we all want.

<u>Special Message from the Pope for the month of October</u>

October is the month of the Rosary and the Holy Father has invited us this year to pray the Rosary every day during this entire Marian month. He wants us to join in communion and in penitence, as the people of God, in asking the Holy Mother of God and Saint Michael Archangel to protect the Church from the devil, who always seeks to separate us from God and from each other. He asks us to conclude the recitation of the Rosary with the ancient invocation *Sub Tuum Praesidium*.

The Russian mystics and the great saints of all the traditions advised, in moments of spiritual turbulence, to shelter beneath the mantle of the Holy Mother of God pronouncing this invocation. May the Holy Mother of God place the Church beneath her protective mantle. Pope Francis has also asked us after the Rosary to add the prayer to Saint Michael Archangel that he protect and help us in the struggle against evil (cf. Rev 12, 7-12). This latter prayer, written by Pope Leo XIII, is, Pope Francis, says the weapon against the Great Accuser who "goes around the world seeking to accuse".

The invocation *Sub Tuum Praesidium* is recited as follows:

We fly to thy protection, O Holy Mother of God.
Do not despise our petitions in our necessities,
but deliver us always from all dangers,
O Glorious and Blessed Virgin.

Prayer to Saint Michael

Holy Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle.

Be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil.

May God rebuke him, we humbly pray; and do thou, O Prince of the heavenly hosts, by the power of God, cast into hell Satan and all the wicked spirits who wander through the world for the ruin of souls. Amen.
