# THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

A few days ago, I went to the cinema to see the film: "First Man". It is the story of Neil Armstrong, the first man on the Moon. It is not just an historical film, it is a kind of "story of a soul", the soul of a man who, despite the appearance of being a "nerd engineer", had a restless heart, in search of the meaning of life.

A month before the launch of Apollo 11, the space-shuttle that reached the Moon, Armstrong, at the request of *Life* magazine, reflected on the meaning of the Moon landing:

"It would be presumptuous of me to pick out a single thing that history will identify as a result of this mission. But I would say that it will enlighten the human race and help us all to comprehend that we are an important part of a much bigger universe than we can normally see from the front porch. I would hope that it will help individuals, the world over, to think in a proper perspective about the various endeavours of mankind as a whole. Perhaps going to the Moon and back in itself isn't all that important. But it is a big enough step to give people a new dimension in their thinking – a sort of enlightenment".

When I read this statement from him, I was struck by the fact that Armstrong was aware that a simple gesture of a man can influence the whole world. If I think carefully about my daily life, it is clear that he is right. Our lives are connected: we follow examples, celebrities, stories... we can't live without been inspired. We can't live alone. We always follow someone or something. Absolute human independence is merely an unreal achievement. Even those who want to be independent from everything and everyone, follow those who stand for this mind set.

The second thing that struck me was the meaning that Armstrong gave to his landing on the Moon: a step to give people a new dimension in their thinking, helping them to see the things from another perspective, a much greater perspective. He explained this in more detail later in the interview:

"If you are in the middle of a crowd, the crowd appears to extend in every direction as far as you can see. You have to step back and look down from the Washington Monument or something like that to see that you're really pretty close to the edge of the crowd, and that the whole picture is quite a bit different from the way it looks when you are in the middle of all those people".

Reading these words, I was thinking about my Christian life: living within the Church has been and is now for me like landing on the Moon, looking at the things from God's perspective. Everything in the life of the Church (praying, celebrating Mass, listening the Gospel, meeting people of our parish...) is the opportunity given to me to take part in the gaze of God, to look at the things, at my problems and challenges, from above. Having God's perspective doesn't mean escaping from this world, and this is the difference with the analogy of Armstrong's story: we don't need to go to the Moon or elsewhere to take a step back and see the "whole picture", our life meaning. God was made flesh, which means that the Moon is on earth: God's perspective, God's eyes are the eyes of the saints that surround us and that live in our community.
