THE ART OF PRUNING

On Sundays and weekdays during the time of Easter we have been reading many parts of St John's gospel, especially those parts which are related to Jesus Christ risen from the dead. We have listened to the gospels proclaiming Jesus as the bread of life, as the good shepherd and as the light of the world. Today we hear that Jesus is the true vine, the Father is the vinedresser and we are the branches that need to be pruned in order to bear more fruit.

"I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser. Every branch in me that bears no fruit he cuts away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes to make it bear even more" (Gv 15, 1-2).

A vinedresser expects a lot from the pruning; he knows it can bear fruit; he has confidence in it. He knows that if it is not pruned, the strength of the vine is wasted; it will bear perhaps more bunches than it should, with the consequence that not all will ripen and that the quality of the wine will be lower. If it remains a long time without being pruned, the vine can even become wild, producing only wild grapes.

God the Father, as a wise vinedresser, does the same with us. He sometimes intervenes in our lives by pruning us, taking away something and removing what is not essential. It is a process that might hurt us at the start, but that is necessary for our spiritual growth. God does not proceed in this way because he is irritated with us, on the contrary, He knows that we need some pruning in order to grow in holiness.

We have seen this act of pruning over the last year. The Coronavirus pandemic has been something negative, which has resulted in many people facing difficult hardships. At the same time, it is true that God used it to prune our lives. Many activities, routines and habits we were used to, have suddenly been removed from us, and for many people this has resulted in a process of spiritual growth. I have heard people say that this year's Holy Week has been more prayerful and reverent. The restricted circumstances helped people to be more focused on the essential. People have said that they have learned the value of silence and simplicity during our celebrations. Other people have spoken about their family and friends, saying that they have learned not to take for granted all those around them.

Through this pandemic we have been pruned and transformed, hopefully for the better.

Leonardo da Vinci defined sculpture as "the art of removing". The other arts consist of adding something: colour in painting, stones in architecture, notes in music. Only sculpture is based on removing, of taking away the pieces of marble that are in excess, so that the figure we have in mind can emerge. Spiritual growth is sometimes obtained in the same way. By pruning us and removing something God helps us to become better people.

Frankenstein by Mary Shelley


Is one of the most influential novels of the nineteenth century and is quite relevant today. What is the role of science and the scientific community? Does mankind have the right to manipulate nature? Have today's scientists developed a moral system to match their speculative knowledge? The questions posed by Mary Shelley still need to be addressed in contemporary society. We are the creatures, not the Creator. This must always be kept in mind.

Frankenstein by Mary Shelley will be presented during the Cultural Friday on the 11th June.

The Shadow of the Father by Jan Dobraczyński Jan Dobraczyński tells the story of Saint Joseph's life in the form of a novel. He uses the evocative image of a shadow to define Joseph. In his relationship to Jesus, Joseph was the earthly shadow of the heavenly Father: he watched over him and protected him, never leaving him to go his own way. This book is an excellent way to live well this year dedicated to St Joseph.
