

Lay Siege to Heaven by Louis De Wohl




Luis de Wohl devotes his considerable talents to an interpretation of one of the most unusual women of all time, Saint Catherine of Siena. The daughter of a prosperous dyer in fourteenth-century Siena, Catherine devoted herself to Christ.

Her career was extraordinary. In that confused and dangerous era of history, the Pope was living at Avignon: Catherine persuaded him to return to Rome. The City-States of Italy were at war with each other: Catherine subdued them. There was pestilence: Catherine served and saved. She performed miracles, she received the stigmata, she drew about her a crowd of devoted men and women.

A saint who would not leave the Lord God alone, she really did lay siege to heaven and changed the face of her world. This novel, which is also a vivid biography, brings Catherine of Siena to life in a remarkable way. She lives on in every page.

God with Us (Encountering Jesus in the Gospel of Matthew) by Edward Sri



During Sunday Mass we are reading the Gospel of Matthew.

God With Us by Edward Sri is an outstanding introduction to the first gospel. Much has been said about why Jesus died. This book focuses on why Jesus lived. It

shows that Jesus didn't just come to be our teacher, a miracle work or prophet, or even just Israel's saviour and redeemer. Jesus is Emmanuel, God with us.

Notable Scripture scholar Edward Sri leads readers on a faithful exploration of Jesus's kingdom-building mission and how it revealed God's presence, which remains with us today.

Helpful discussion questions are provided for personal and group study.

Five Loaves and Two Fish by Cardinal Francis Xavier Nguyen Van Thuan



Venerable Cardinal Francis-Xavier Nguyen Van Thuan spent thirteen years in communist prisons in his home country of Vietnam. A priest of extraordinary faith and courage, he still remained in contact with the faithful under his care by sending out secret messages of encouragement and advice on scraps of paper from his prison cell.

In Five Loaves and Two Fish, a book drawn from his remarks to young people at the 1997 World Youth Day in Paris, Cardinal Van Thuan reflects on his life and his relationship with God and his Church.

The Cardinal's story of suffering for God and his Church, told in his own words, is extraordinary enough. But it is the spiritual insights and reflections he shares in this book that make it a moving and essential read for any Catholic. Five Loaves and Two

Fish is joyful and greatly encouraging, a powerful and contemporary testimony of faith. Like St. Paul, also imprisoned for his faith, Cardinal Van Thuan reminds us that a life devoted to God is the only one worth living, no matter the circumstances. Guidelines For Public Mass in Our Parish


We have now begun to have public Masses across our Parish. Please read the following carefully to help you decide if coming back to Mass is safe for you. Please let us know if you have questions.


- 1) Even if everyone desires to come back to Mass, parishioners are currently not obliged to attend Sunday Mass, and ought not attend if the following apply:
- For example if they are sick, or experiencing cold or flu like symptoms
- They are experiencing symptoms of a serious illness, or if they are in the "vulnerable" category (the elderly, people with weakened immune systems, people with long term conditions such as cancer, diabetes, heart conditions etc.)

It is envisaged that the Sunday obligation will not be imposed until the latter phases of the lifting of restrictions.

- 2) Alcohol hand gel is provided at the church doors. Parishioners should sanitize their hands as they enter and leave the church.
- 3) Stewards will be at the Church entrance to assist parishioners when they enter, leave, and during Mass. They will make sure social distancing is respected.
- 4) Churches have been marked out with appropriate signage to make sure social distancing is respected.
- 5) We have a limited space available in our churches. When the maximum number is reached it will not be possible to enter the church.
- 6) We encourage parishioners to come 15 minutes before Mass starts to help the work of the stewards.
- 7) Parishioners should wear masks or face coverings during Mass.
- 8) There will be no physical sign of peace. People may still turn to one another and say "Peace be with you."
- 9) The Eucharist will be distributed under one kind only; distribution of Holy Communion from the Chalice is suspended.
- 10) When giving Holy Communion in the hand, the priest will ensure that the host is placed in the hand of the recipient in such a way that there is not touching and that the maximum possible social distance is maintained.

- 13) We encourage parishioners to make their offering by Direct Debit or Standing Order. In any case a basket will be placed at church exits and parishioners may put their collection there.
- 14) If a parishioner attending Mass does develop Covid, they or their family should make the parish aware.

Volunteers

We need your help. Volunteers are needed to manage the opening of the churches, stewards to ensure and maintain social distancing, cleaners to ensure that we have a clean environment and counters to count, record and store the offertory money.

Who can be a volunteer?

People who are in the High or Moderate Risk Groups, as defined by the NHS, at this stage cannot be volunteers. This includes those people who are 70 yrs. or more and those who have underlying health conditions. This is to ensure that these groups of people are protected during this time of transition. As the situation is changing rapidly, this can be reviewed and we are hopeful that we can be more inclusive in the near future. If you want to help as a volunteer please contact the following people.
